IMPORTANT DATES

Primary Election Day: May 20, 2025

Election Day: November 4, 2025

VOTER QUALIFICATIONS

To register in Pennsylvania, you must be:

- A U.S. citizen for at least one month before Election Day.
- A resident of Pennsylvania and your County and Election District for at least 30 days before Election Day.
- Age 18 or older on or before the date of the next Election Day.

REGISTRATION

Register or re-register if you are not currently registered, have not voted at least once during the last two calendar years, wish to change your political party affiliation, or have moved. Residents must register at least 30 days prior to an election. Military personnel may apply at any time. There are three ways to register:

IN PERSON: Apply in person at the Montgomery County Voter Registration Office (Norristown) or at PennDOT Photo or Driver License Centers and other select government agencies.

ONLINE: Apply online by visiting www.pavoterservices.pa.gov.

BY MAIL: Apply by mail by submitting a completed Pennsylvania Voter Registration Application to the Montgomery County Voter Registration Office.

ELECTIONS

To participate in a political party's Primary Election, you must be a registered member of that party. Any registered voter may cast a ballot for any candidate in General Elections.

ABSENTEE AND MAIL IN VOTING

Residents have two options for mail in ballots in Montgomery County: absentee and mail-in ballots.

ABSENTEE BALLOT: For residents who will be away during the election and are unable to vote in person, have a disability, or an illness.

MAIL-IN BALLOT: For all other voters who wish to vote by mail, but are not an absentee voter.

REQUESTING A BALLOT: Residents can apply for an absentee or mail in ballot online, by mail, or at designated locations. For more information and important deadlines visit www.votespa.com.





POLICE

MISSION

The members of the Abington Township Police Department will be guided by the values of our community and will faithfully perform their duties in accordance with the United States Constitution, the International Code of Police Ethics and all federal, state and local laws.

To help accomplish this mission, the Department has adopted the motto, "To Protect and Serve with PRIDE."

DIVISIONS

The Department is comprised of 92 sworn officers organized into 4 divisions.

PATROL: Responsible for uniformed and plain clothes patrol duties, bicycle patrol, honor guard, traffic enforcement, accident investigation, emergency response, K-9, SWAT Team, and crisis negotiation.

DETECTIVE: Responsible for criminal investigations, forensics, drug investigations, intelligence, evidence management, applicant background checks, and juvenile crime investigations.

COMMUNITY POLICING: Responsible for crime prevention, youth-oriented, and community-based initiatives, Traffic Safety Unit, D.A.R.E, Youth Aid Panel, Police Athletic League, Victim Service Liaison Unit, and linkage with community groups.

ADMINISTRATIVE: Responsible for budgeting, personnel, data processing, training, facilities management, purchasing, crime and traffic safety unit, statistics, and communications.

ACCREDITATION

The Abington Township Police Department maintains accreditation from the Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Accreditation Committee (PLEAC) and Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA). The Department has also been recognized nationally and internationally for its programming, receiving the prestigious Community Policing Award from the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) twice!

PROGRAMS & PARTNERSHIPS

Programming and partnerships allow the Police Department to be an active partner in the community and provide services that contribute to the quality of life of residents. Information on programs, partners, how to participate or how to get involved can be found at www.abingtonpd.org. Popular programs and partnerships include:

Law Enforcement Treatment Initiative (LETI); Veterans Response Team (VRT); Auxiliary Police; Lock for Life; Citizens and Police Together (C.A.P.T.); Town Watch Program; Dog Walk and Watch Program; Away Home Notification Program; Citizens Police Academy; HUB; Volunteers in Policing (V.I.P.); The Abington Police Athletic League (PAL); Abington Township Police Explorers; Youth Aid Panel; Abington Community Taskforce; School Resource Officers; Kids in Safety Seats (K.I.S.S.); Take Me Home; Victim Service Liaison Unit and Red Light Camera Program.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT: CO-RESPONDER PROGRAM

The Police Department has established a "Co-Responder" position. The Co-Responder Program, popular in other counties within our region, pairs social service professionals with police in an effort to divert people away from the criminal justice system. The co-responder responds to 911 calls involving individuals who are suffering from mental health and drug concerns in all areas of the population including children, teens, adults, and older adults. The following are typical situations which can benefit from the co-responder's assistance: suicidal thoughts without attempt, strange or bizarre behavior, persons with known mental illness disconnected from services and causing community concern, family and domestic violence, child and adolescent issues without criminality, runaways, possible need for Adult or Child Protective Services, repeat callers who request attention unrelated to legal issues, victims and families of traumatic events, geriatric issues with unknown needs for service, individuals seeking support for substance use disorder. Once law enforcement officers arrive at the scene, and once the scene is deemed safe, the officer calls for the co-responder's help. At times, the co-responder rides with officer(s) on patrol, and when safe to do so, can immediately respond to the incident. The co-responder keeps officers informed of available county resources, mental health system changes, and the disposition of each case as permitted by law. This team effort partners law enforcement officers with a social service professional who is knowledgeable and equipped with time and resources not readily available to officers on patrol. This program helps address the social service needs of individuals contacting 911 Emergency Services to effect the following outcomes: decrease the time law enforcement spends in response to a situation involving social service needs, provide a more effective emergency response through the addition of clinical-informed support and an enhanced community resource knowledge base, ensure those who outreach for an emergency response receive timely and streamlined connection to resources to address their social service needs, and divert individuals with primary social service needs from further penetration into the criminal justice system. This program will have an invaluable impact on the Abington Community as a whole. In almost all of these cases family, friends and sometimes neighbors, are negatively affected by these scenarios. The ability to assist those who are struggling with these problems, by involving a trained and trauma-informed specialist, would have a positive influence on so many other residents' lives.

GET INVOLVED

Citizen volunteers are one of the Police Department's most important assets! Many of our programs would not exist without the participation of dedicated volunteers. Each year volunteers donate more than 10,000 hours of their time to assist the department with various programs like our Auxiliary Police Program, Town Watch, Citizens and Police Together and the Abington Police Athletic League to name a few. ENGINEERING & OPERATIONS

ENGINEERING DIVISION

The Engineering Division provides general engineering services, oversight and project management for capital and non-capital projects and Township infrastructure; coordination and oversight of all utility companies working within the Township; grant administration, and direction and control related to engineering matters throughout the Township.

STORMWATER UPDATES

Stormwater runoff is one of the leading causes of water pollution, not only in Abington Township, but across the nation. Many residents in Abington are unaware that storm drains carry runoff directly to the nearest stream instead of connecting to a treatment plant to get cleaned first. Since 2003, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection has permitted the Township's Stormwater System and has implemented standards and requirements intended to help clean up Abington's impaired streams.

We all can do our part to help with restoring the health of our streams. The most basic way to help is to never dump anything you wouldn't drink or swim in directly or indirectly down a storm drain. Things you can do include:

- Installing Rain Barrels at our homes to cut down on stormwater runoff.
- Don't throw grass, leaves, or trash in the storm inlets or in the street.
- Use less fertilizer on lawns.
- Recycle used oil.
- Pick up pet waste.
- Dispose of household hazardous waste responsibly.

WASTEWATER DIVISION

Abington Township sanitary sewers are divided into three areas. Abington owns and operates a wastewater treatment plant located on Fitzwatertown Road, which receives flows from the western third of the township and is permitted for 3.91 million gallons per day by EPA, the PaDEP and DRBC. The areas east of Edge Hill Road are conveyed directly to the Philadelphia Water Department's (PWD) Pennypack interceptor sanitary sewer system and the southern areas of the township flow into the Cheltenham Township interceptor system, which is also conveyed to PWD. There are seven connections from Abington into this interceptor, which are metered. The sewer collection system consists of approximately 250 miles of various sized pipe and 17 pump stations.

AVOID CLOGGED PIPES!

Sanitary sewer pipes are sized for water flow. Prevent clogs by placing any foreign object in the trash and not down the drain. These items will easily clog the pipes and cause a backup into your basement or first floor sinks and toilets. Please respect your neighbors by not flushing these objects into the sewers to prevent blockages. Most common sources of clogs include:

- Cleaning or baby wipes
- Paper towels, rags or cloths
- Plastic items
- Garbage from kitchen disposal
- Cooking oils and grease

If you and your neighbors are all experiencing backups or slow draining pipes, the sewer main is most likely blocked. If only your drain is backing up or slow, you will need to hire a plumber to clean the pipes and remove the blockage. If the sewer main is blocked or you see water flowing out of a manhole, call 215-884-8329 to report the problem.

MEDICINE DOES NOT BELONG IN THE DRAIN!

NEVER flush medicines or supplements down the drain. The pills will dissolve and eventually pollute the streams and contaminate downstream drinking water intakes. A drop off is available at the Abington Township Police Department.

PUBLIC WORKS DIVISION

HOLIDAY TREES: Discard holiday trees on your trash days in January. Please do not put trees in plastic bags.

SHREDDING EVENTS: 9 AM to 12 PM, Abington Township Highway Yard: April 26th and October 18th.

BI-ANNUAL TOWNSHIP-WIDE CLEAN-UP: April 7th through the 11th and October 6th through the 10th. During these weeks, on your normal trash day, we will take everything that you put out in your regular trash can plus any additional normal trash placed in store-purchased refuse bags. No electronics, hazardous waste, construction material or large item pick-ups will be accepted. For a list of large item pick-ups refer to our website at www.abingtonpa.gov/largeitempickup.

ELECTRONICS COLLECTIONS: 9 AM to 12 PM, Abington Township Highway Yard: February 22nd and November 15th. There is a fee for TVs and monitors.

EXCESS TRASH: Residents can schedule a large item pick-up for black contractor bags at \$1 each by visiting www.abingtonpa.gov/largeitempickup or calling 267-536-1036. As always, an additional or larger cart can be requested for a fee by calling 267-536-1036.

TRASH CART EXCHANGES: Residents can exchange their cart for a different size (smaller or for an additional fee - larger) year round by calling 267-536-1036 or 1038.

TRASH COLLECTION: The trash day for every address in Abington Township can be found by going to www.abingtonpa.gov/trash and selecting "When is my trash and recyclable collection day?" under Frequently Used Services and Asked Questions. Residents can also use the "Resident Lookup Map" by clicking on "Resident Information" next to "News" on the homepage.

SPECIAL TRASH PICK-UPS: Abington has a large item/bulk pick-up service for a fee. For a full list of items or to schedule a pick up, please visit www.abingtonpa.gov/largeitempickup. Abington Township accepts no construction material.

YARD WASTE: Yard waste, consisting of leaves, grass and plant clippings, is accepted in 30-gallon brown biodegradable paper bags and/or 32 gallon maximum trash cans labeled YARD WASTE. Dirt, stones, trash and recyclables should never be mixed in with yard waste. Brush and tree limbs in 3 foot maximum lengths and branches measuring no greater than 3 inches in diameter must be bundled and tied. Yard waste bags, cans and bundles weighing no more than 30 lbs. each are picked up on the same day as your regular trash day. Brown biodegradable bags can be purchased at most large retail stores and home improvement stores. Yard waste is never picked up the day following a holiday where the township offices are closed and appears on the calendar page with an image of a circle with a line through it in addition to written text.

ABOUT THE ATFD

The Abington Township Fire Department (ATFD) is the All-Volunteer Fire Department that has been protecting the residents of Abington since the founding of the Abington Fire Company in 1889. Today, the ATFD is comprised of five fire companies staffed by approximately 230 volunteers responding to emergency calls for service every day of the year. The ATFD has been accredited through the Center for Public Safety Excellence since 2013 and is the only all-volunteer department in the United States to achieve this status. Our dedicated volunteers respond day or night, regardless of weather conditions, holidays and family events. The ATFD responds to an average of 1,700 calls for service each year and provides an average of 24,000 hours of volunteer service to the residents of Abington every year.

FRIENDLY REMINDERS

- Open burning is prohibited in Abington Township with the exception of the use of cooking and fire pits using an appliance designed and approved for such use.
- Change the batteries in your smoke detectors.
- Install a carbon monoxide detector unit.
- If you use a wood burning stove or fireplace, always ensure the ashes are placed in a metal container outside the home for two days prior to emptying in the trash.
- Have your heaters and chimneys inspected and cleaned on a regular basis.

FIRE & CODE SERVICES: CODE ENFORCEMENT DIVISION

All construction projects within the Township of Abington are subject to the requirements of the 2018 Uniform Construction Code and the Zoning Ordinance of the Township of Abington. Permit applications must be complete at the time of submission.

All contractors, plumbers, electricians and other mechanics are required to register with the Code Enforcement Office and/or the PA Attorney General's Office. Proof of liability and workers' compensation insurance is required, and the Township of Abington must be listed as a certificate holder. Please contact us at 267-536-1000, prompt 4 for additional information.

The Property Maintenance Officers would like to remind all property owners and occupants that both the interior and exterior of the property must be maintained in good repair, structurally sound, and sanitary, so it does not pose a threat to the public's health, safety and/or welfare. FINANCE

Our goal is to provide financial support services and oversight that will aid the Board of Commissioners, Township Manager, and Operating Departments in the decision-making process and in the common goal of providing the best possible services at the lowest possible costs to the Township's tax payers.

20TH CONSECUTIVE ANNUAL REPORT AWARD

The Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting has been awarded to the Township of Abington for the **twentieth** consecutive year by the Government Finance Officer's Association of the US and Canada (GFOA) for its Annual Comprehensive Financial Report. The certificate of achievement is the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting, and its attainment represents a significant accomplishment by a government and its management. The annual report has been judged by an impartial panel to meet the high standards of the program including demonstrating a constructive "spirit of full disclosure" to clearly communicate its financial story and motivate potential users and user groups to read the annual report. The GFOA is a nonprofit professional association serving approximately 23,000 government finance professionals with offices in Chicago, IL, and Washington D.C. DELINQUENT USER FEES

At the start of each new year, the Tax Collector forwards the list of unpaid sewer rent and refuse fees (user fees), from the prior year, to the Finance Department for collection. This amount is in addition to any notices received from Montgomery County Tax Claim Bureau. The Finance Department notifies property owners of delinquencies and directs them to call and arrange a payment plan. If these requests are ignored, the account will be turned over to an attorney (Portnoff Law Associates) for collection. This action is only taken on property owners not complying with a payment plan and could add significant costs to the bill.

If you have received a notice of delinquency from the Finance Department on sewer rents and refuse fees, please call the Finance Department at 267-536-1049 for payment arrangements. If you have been contacted by Portnoff Law Associates you may call them directly at 866-211-9466.

2025 BUDGET

The 2025 Abington Township budget was underway at the time of this publication. It will be adopted by December 31, 2024. To find the 2025 budget, please visit www.abingtonpa.gov/budget. There you will find this and previous years budgets.

Beginning in 2022, the Township utilizes an interactive budget platform, OpenGov for budgeting. OpenGov serves as an interactive tool for all citizens and visitors and provides greater financial transparency throughout the calendar year.

2025 BUDGET PROCESS

The Township Fiscal Year begins on January 1 and ends on December 31 of each calendar year. The Township budget is a 365 days per year evaluative process that begins with the Township Manager developing strategies, goals and guiding principles based on the Board of Commissioners goals and objectives. Such goals and objectives serve as a basis and driver for appropriation decision-making, and as a guide for the Administration, and subsequently all departments.

A Preliminary Proposed Annual Budget and accompanying message is prepared, and is presented as the preliminary spending plan for Board consideration in accordance with the Code of Ordinance(s) of the Township of Abington and Laws of the Commonwealth, specifically the First-Class Township Code and related laws. The formal adoption of the Fiscal Year Proposed Budget is typically scheduled for a public meeting in November, with final and official adoption no later than December 31 of each calendar year. The Office of the Township Manager and Finance Department work in concert to ensure all financial policies are prudent and met, with Finance serving as the primary means and method for managing resources.

PARKS AND RECREATION

Abington Township is home to over 30 public parks, including a skate park, two swimming pools, a nature center with a museum and bird observatory, a bird reserve and more. The Department runs programs at its facilities year-round for children, teens, adults and seniors.

HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION

Get to Know the Abington Human Relations Commission

Abington Township prohibits discrimination in HOUSING, EMPLOYMENT, and PUBLIC ACCOMMODATIONS (in Township Ordinance #2029) on the basis of ACTUAL or PERCEIVED race, color, religious creed, ancestry, sex, national origin, handicap or disability, use of guide or support animals because of blindness, deafness, or physical disability, sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression. The Abington Human Relations Commission promotes the provisions of this ordinance through education, mediation, and community outreach. The Commission strives to ensure that all members of the community enjoy equality and equal protection under law.

The AHRC is composed of seven volunteer residents appointed by the Board of Commissioners. It is non-partisan and provides its services free of charge. It also offers a variety of outreach programs to Township organizations and businesses to explain the Ordinance and offers suggestions that can assist in avoiding problems. In addition, the Commission sponsors and hosts community dialogues on issues of concern to the community.

If a Township resident feels they have been the victim of discrimination based on being a member of any of the protected classes (listed above), they can contact the AHRC to discuss the situation and formally request mediation. A Commission member will look into the situation.

ANIMAL CONTROL

The Animal Control Officer will respond to all sick, injured, or threatening animals. His office will also provide references and information for all other pest/wildlife issues.

Ordinance No. 1432 of Abington Township governs dog control i.e., Running at Large; Leashing; Offensive Odors; Excessive Noise; Animals Creating Nuisances, etc.

Ordinance No. 1903 of Abington Township governs stray or feral cats.

Dogs are required to be licensed and tagged.

A dog license is the best and most convenient proof of ownership. It also serves as a means of identification should your pet be lost. To obtain a license, visit:
