2025 BOARD PRESIDENT AND TOWNSHIP MANAGER UPDATES

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

2025 will be a year of change in Abington. On behalf of my fellow Commissioners, it is our pleasure to welcome Christopher S. Christman as our new Township Manager. We have full confidence that Mr. Christman will execute on the priorities of the Board of Commissioners as outlined in the FY 2025 budget, priorities which will transform our public spaces and create new recreational opportunities for our community.

Not only does the FY 2025 budget propose no increases in property taxes, refuse and sewer fees for the third consecutive year, it provides a transformative investment in our parks system. The Board of Commissioners strategically decided to use remaining American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to address and improve the physical infrastructure of our Parks and pools and to provide seed funding for the Economic Development Corporation. These investments will provide immediate recreational and tourism benefits and provide resources to develop the business community along Easton Road. In the long term, they can provide the economic stability we need to maintain and enhance our services without burdening our residential tax base and provide an opportunity to increase our community's quality of life through additional recreational programming and opportunities. We know what financial challenges lie ahead and it is investments like those found in this 2025 budget that will help offset future needs and continue to make Abington a "best place to live."

It is not by coincidence that the Board prioritized Parks and Recreation. We have heard your feedback; feedback which prompted the update to the Recreation, Parks and Open Space (RPOS) Plan. The RPOS planning process was publicly driven and the recommendations from it have directly informed the projects in which we are investing. Simply put, we are investing in your ideas, your needs, and your aspirations for the community. This is good government at work and we will continue these efforts to serve you and all of our neighbors to ensure that Abington remains a vibrant community well into the future. We are proud to engage in this work with you and on your behalf.

A MESSAGE FROM THE TOWNSHIP MANAGER

As your new Township Manager, it is my pleasure to introduce you to the 2025 Spring and Summer Activities Guide and Budget Update. As someone who is new to the Abington community, it is apparent that this guide serves as an important resource for accessing recreational and service opportunities across all Township departments, from Parks and Recreation to Police Services, from the Library to Public Works; it is clear there is a lot going on in Abington. It is my sincere hope that our community takes advantage of all the Township has to offer and that we can continue to build out our programming to meet the evolving needs of our residents.

I am looking forward to continuing the important initiatives underway; guiding the priorities of the Board of Commissioners; and enhancing our parks systems as approved in the FY 2025 budget. Our former Township Manager's budget message outlines the FY 2025 budget and I encourage all residents to view it and explore the innerworkings of the online budget book at www.abingtonpa.gov/2025budget. I am happy to report that this year's budget does not propose an increase in property taxes, refuse nor sewer fees. The total FY 2025 budget for all operating, capital and ARPA funds is \$93,421,770, with the general fund totaling \$49,925,345, all other operating funds totaling \$21,644,853, general fund improvement capital fund totaling \$6,574,418, and American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) fund totaling \$12,132,654.

Through this budget, the Board of Commissioners have allocated over 12 million dollars in ARPA funds to Parks and Recreation projects. This extraordinary investment will transform the facilities we have today and is an important and needed investment in our community fields, pools, and recreational spaces. It cannot be overstated just how impactful this investment will be to how our facilities are used and enjoyed by each of you, your loved ones, friends and neighbors.

I look forward to serving as your Township Manager and beginning the exciting work ahead of us in 2025!



REGISTER EARLY FOR PROGRAMS

Many of our programs need a minimum number of participants to run, so a program may be canceled if there are not enough registrants. REGISTRATION POLICY

Please complete the registration and waiver forms on PAGES 38 - 41 or <u>REGISTER ONLINE</u> at <u>www.abingtonpa.gov/PRregistration</u>. You will be considered registered for a program only after the proper forms and fees are received by the Parks and Recreation Department before the stated deadline. You will not receive a confirmation unless otherwise noted. Registrations without accompanying fees will NOT be accepted. If you mail a registration in, the registration will be entered at the end of the work day. Non-residents may have a delayed registration start date and/or a higher registration fee.

PAYMENT FOR PROGRAM

Payment is due at the time of registration. You may pay by Visa, Master Card, Discover, American Express, branded debit card, cash, or check. Checks should be made payable to "ABINGTON TOWNSHIP". All returned checks will be assessed a fee of \$25. If it is a Briar Bush Nature Center program (pages 19 - 22), please make checks payable to: "FRIENDS OF BRIAR BUSH". Separate checks are encouraged. List all participants in the family on one form but send a separate check for each program. This way if one program is full, it does not affect everyone, since payment must be processed in order to be considered registered in a program.

Soccer Shots is an energetic children's soccer program with a focus on character development. We positively impact children's lives on and off the field through our best-in-class coaching, communication, and curriculum.

Soccer Shots Mini (2-3 years old) is a high-energy program introducing children to fundamental soccer principles, such as using your feet, dribbling, and the basic rules of the game. AIKIDO

Aikido is a Japanese martial art developed by Morohei Ueshiba; his goal was to create an art that practitioners could use to defend themselves while also protecting their attackers from injury. Because the aikido curriculum consists of throws, beginners learn how to safely fall or roll. The specific techniques for attack include both strikes and grabs; techniques for defense consist of throws and pins. After basic techniques are learned, students study freestyle defense against multiple opponents, and techniques with weapons. Aikido related training emphasizes the use of coordinated whole-body movement and balance similar to yoga and Pilates.

YOUTH PROGRAMS

LIFEGUARD CERTIFICATION

The primary purpose of the courses in the American Red Cross Lifeguarding program is to provide participants with the knowledge and skills needed to:

- Prevent, recognize and respond to aquatic emergencies in deep water pools (7 feet or greater)
- Provide professional-level care for breathing and cardiac emergencies, injuries, and sudden illnesses until emergency medical services (EMS) professionals take over. All participants must attend the entire course, participate in all class sessions, and complete the online course work before the first class.

Course Prerequisites

To participate in the lifeguarding (including deep water) course, participants must:

- Be at least 15 years old on or before the final scheduled session of the lifeguarding course.
- Successfully complete the two prerequisite swimming skills evaluations:

<u>Prerequisite 1</u>: Complete a swim-tread-swim sequence without stopping to rest: Jump into the water and totally submerge, resurface then swim 150 yards using the front crawl, breaststroke or a combination of both. (Swimming on the back or side is not permitted. Swim goggles are allowed.) Without a break, tread water using only the legs for 2 minutes; then swim 50 yards using the front crawl, breaststroke or a combination of both.

<u>Prerequisite 2</u>: Complete a timed event within 1 minute, 40 seconds: Starting in the water, swim 20 yards. (The face may be in or out of the water. Swim goggles are not allowed). Surface dive (feet-first or head-first) to a depth of 7 - 10 feet to retrieve a 10-pound object. Return to the surface and swim 20 yards on the back to return to the starting point, holding the object at the surface with both hands and keeping the face out at or near the surface. Exit the water without using a ladder or steps.

LIFEGUARD CERTIFICATION

The primary purpose of the courses in the American Red Cross Lifeguarding program is to provide participants with the knowledge and skills needed to:

- Prevent, recognize and respond to aquatic emergencies in deep water pools (7 feet or greater)
- Provide professional-level care for breathing and cardiac emergencies, injuries, and sudden illnesses until emergency medical services (EMS) professionals take over. All participants must attend the entire course, participate in all class sessions, and complete the online course work before the first class.

Course Prerequisites

To participate in the lifequarding (including deep water) course, participants must:

- Be at least 15 years old on or before the final scheduled session of the lifeguarding course.
- Successfully complete the two prerequisite swimming skills evaluations:

<u>Prerequisite 1</u>: Complete a swim-tread-swim sequence without stopping to rest: Jump into the water and totally submerge, resurface then swim 150 yards using the front crawl, breaststroke or a combination of both. (Swimming on the back or side is not permitted. Swim goggles are allowed.) Without a break, tread water using only the legs for 2 minutes; then swim 50 yards using the front crawl, breaststroke or a combination of both.

Prerequisite 2: Complete a timed event within 1 minute, 40 seconds:

Starting in the water, swim 20 yards. (The face may be in or out of the water. Swim goggles are not allowed). Surface dive (feet-first or head-first) to a depth of 7 – 10 feet to retrieve a 10-pound object. Return to the surface and swim 20 yards on the back to return to the starting point, holding the object at the surface with both hands and keeping the face out at or near the surface. Exit the water without using a ladder or steps.



CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY

Each year the Abington Police Department offers a Citizens' Police Academy (CPA). In the program, Township residents meet on a weekly basis with Police Officer instructors for lessons on various aspects of the law enforcement profession. Subjects include criminal and traffic law, the police role in the judicial process, APD equipment, training, resources and limitations of the Police Department. In return, the instructors often find a newly-developed law enforcement awareness among participants, as well as an increased sensitivity to the challenges of 21st century policing. The increased citizen-police understanding that results from the close interaction of the CPA environment is an excellent vehicle for building bridges between the police and the community.

Not surprisingly, program alumni often volunteer to assist with future projects for APD and the community. Graduates are also encouraged to participate as block captains leading their neighborhood to crime prevention information, awareness and educational programs. TYPES OF MEMBERSHIP

Season Membership

A season membership is valid from May 24 through September 1, 2025. Pools open on Saturdays and Sundays beginning May 24 and for daily use beginning June 21.

Household Season Membership

A household is defined as all individuals occupying a single family dwelling. Everyone being considered as a household will need to prove by way of official documentation, that they reside at the address listed on the pool application. There is no maximum number of household members. After three (3) household members have signed up for a seasonal membership, each additional individual will be charged an additional fee as listed below.

Daily Admission Pass

The daily admission pass is a type of membership and not a one day pass. An individual must go in person to Alverthorpe Manor to pay a one time fee and receive an ID card. Once registration is complete, the resident can visit the pools for a daily fee. The Township does not offer a one day only pass. If you have any questions, please call 215-576-5213.

Guest Privileges

Residents with a pool membership automatically receive guest privileges and can bring 5 guests or less per visit for a nominal fee listed below. Each guest must complete the Township's General Liability and Release before entry into the pool. Parent/Guardian must sign on behalf of youth guests. The forms can be found online at www.abingtonpa.gov/waivers or at the front desk. Non-residents are not permitted to bring guests.

POOL ID-REQUIRED

All members, both daily and seasonal, will be issued photo identification cards which must be shown for admission into pool area. Photo identification cards must be taken at the Parks & Recreation office between scheduled business hours. Identification cards are not transferable. If a card is used by someone other than the authorized purchaser, it must be surrendered and no refund will be made. Lost cards must be reported immediately to the Pool Management. Cards should be retained from year to year and DO NOT expire. There is a fee of \$5 to replace a lost ID card.

REFUNDS

Refunds for pool memberships must be requested two (2) full weeks before the opening date of the pools and will be assessed a 20% refund fee. There are NO refunds after opening day.



HOW TO REGISTER
